3. City Council Meeting Minutes Approval

Approve the minutes of the City Council Special and Regular meetings of November 5, 2018.

4. Ordinance Adoption - Modify Solid Waste Container Retrieval Timeframes

Adopt an Ordinance to amend Section 7.16.040 "Property Nuisance" to limit the time period waste containers are allowed to be visible on streets, sidewalks, and public right-of-ways.

5. Excess Workers' Compensation Insurance 2019 and 2020

Approve the purchase of excess workers' compensation insurance from Safety National for an amount projected to be \$316,165 for the two-year period commencing January 1, 2019 and ending December 31, 2020.

6. Police Department Classification Updates and Reclassifications

Adopt a Resolution to approve job specifications and salary ranges for a new Senior Community Services Officer (CSO) classification; reallocate two incumbent CSO positions to new classifications of Community Engagement and Public Relations Coordinator and Facilities Coordinator; and reclassify two vacant CSO positions to Police Evidence Analyst and Senior CSO.

7. <u>Juvenile Diversion Program Case Management Services - Agreement and Amendment</u>

Approve an agreement with the Youth Service Bureau of the Urban Services Branch of the YMCA of San Francisco for Juvenile Diversion Program Case Management services in the amount of \$111,500; approve Amendment No. 2 to the agreement with the County of San Mateo for reimbursement in an amount not to exceed \$85,263 for case management services for the San Mateo Police Department Juvenile Diversion Program, which brings the amount of reimbursement received over the life of the agreement to a total not to exceed \$330,263; and authorize the Chief of Police to execute these documents.

8. Personal Computer Replacements - Purchase

Adopt a Resolution to approve a Master Purchasing Agreement and Participating Addendum with CDW-G for the purchase of 298 computers per the City's computer replacement schedule in an amount of \$481,842.90 and authorize the Director of Information Technology to execute the agreement.

Office of Traffic Safety - Grant Spending Plan

10. 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Audit and Financial Reports

Accept and file the 2017 - 2018 annual audited financial reports for the City, the annual required financial reports for the Federal Programs/Grants (Single Audit), the Measure "A" half cent sales tax, the Appropriations Limit (Gann Limit), and the Auditors' Communication with Those Charged with Governance (AU 380 Letter).

11. <u>Environmental Protection Agency Green Power Program - Agreements</u>

Approve two partnership agreements with the Environmental Protection Agency in order to be recognized for the City's use of green power communitywide and in municipal facilities at no cost and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreements.

12. Compressed Natural Gas Vehicle Maintenance Facility Maintenance Bay Design and Retrofit - Agreement

Approve an agreement with EFS West Inc. to design and retrofit two existing vehicle maintenance bays at the City of San Mateo Corporation Yard to accommodate compressed natural gas vehicles in the amount of \$241,406; establish a contingency of \$25,000; and authorize the Public Works Director to execute the agreement in substantially the form presented and issue change orders within the contingency amount.

13. Bay Meadows Affordable Housing Project - Loan Document Approvals

Approve loan related documents for the development of Bay Meadows Affordable Housing and authorize City Manager to execute the loan documents, related documents, and approve future revisions with the concurrence of the City Attorney, so long as the changes do not alter the substantial rights and obligations of the City.

14. Fire Apparatus Maintenance - Change Orders

Approve change orders for apparatus maintenance in Fiscal Year 2018-19 to decrease the Central County Fire Department purchase order by \$75,000 and increase the Burns Truck & Trailer Services purchase by \$75,000 and authorize the Fire Chief to execute the change orders.

15. Homeless Emergency Aid Program - Shelter Crisis Declaration

Adopt a Resolution to declare a homeless shelter crisis in connection with the County of San Mateo application to the Homeless Emergency Aid Program.

PUBLIC HEARING

16. Emergency Ordinance Adoption - Temporarily Prohibiting Commercial Operation of Electric Scooter Businesses and LimeBike Agreement Amendment

Kathy Kleinbaum, Assistant City Manager, provided the presentation on the need for an emergency ordinance for electric scooters, noting that this is a temporary ordinance until a proper code amendment can be proposed. Council asked questions of staff. Public Comment - Robert Harker stated scooters are unsafe. EV Ellington noted that LimeBike is concerned about the ban. Evan Adams stated he is in favor of the LimeBike scooters and prefers no ban. Adina Levin stated scooters provide great option for short trips and acknowledged more infrastructure is needed. Fritz Knochenhauer stated there is a lack of infrastructure for alternative methods of transportation to the automobile.

Motion by Freschet, second by Papan, to Adopt an Emergency Ordinance to temporarily prohibit the commercial operation of electric scooter businesses and approve an amendment to the LimeBike Services Agreement removing electric scooters from the allowed bicycle fleet. The motion carried by the following vote:

Tracy Scramaglia, Senior Engineer, provided the staff presentation on amending the fee schedule for wireless telecommunications facilities permits. She noted the resolution proposed has a revision. Council asked questions of staff. Public Comment: There were no speakers.

Motion by Freschet, second by Papan, to Adopt a revised Resolution to amend the Master Fee Schedule for the Wireless Telecommunications Facilities Permit Fee. The motion carried by the following vote:

19. <u>Assistance to Tenants Displaced from Unsafe or Substandard Units - Discussion on Features of a</u> Proposed Ordinance

Christine Civiletti, Code Enforcement Manager, provided information on the a possible red tag ordinance. She commented the County of San Mateo has a good ordinance that addresses displaced tenants in red tag circumstances and noted staff plans to bring a draft ordinance to the Council for consideration early next year. Council asked questions of staff and staff confirmed all party complaints are confidential and there is an anonymous tip line in place. Public Comment: Evan Adams appreciates that this is being considered and Carol Eldridge spoke about the need for this ordinance.

21. Eliminate All Positions in the Fire Department and Authorize a Supplemental Budget Appropriation.

Human Resources Director Casey Echarte presented information on the need to abolish all positions within the Fire Department, lay-off or receive resignations from all current Fire Department employees in order for them to be hired by the new Fire JPA "San Mateo Consolidated Fire Department" and explained the required financing needed to complete the requested action includes a general fund budget appropriation to offset the loss of 401(h) contributions for current Fire unit employees. City Attorney Shawn Mason, proposed amended language for paragraph 4 in the Resolution having to do with the City Manager's authority and requested the term "who resign in lieu of being laid off as necessary" be inserted after "employees" in the paragraph. Public Comment - there were no speakers.

Motion by Goethals, second by Rodriguez, to Adopt a Resolution, as amended, to eliminate all of the positions in the City of San Mateo's Fire Department with the commencement of operations for the San Mateo Consolidated Fire Department which occurs on January 13, 2019, and authorize a supplemental budget appropriation in the amount of \$3,200,000. The motion carried by the following vote:
