As a nearby resident of the proposed project at 201 N. Amphlett Blvd., this is my official protest to the director's decision granting permit for the minor wireless permit. It should also serve as an appeal as outlined in SMMC 17.10.070. Please let me know what fees are due for appeal, if any. If allowable, I'd like to protest the small tower proposed next to the San Mateo High School on Delaware as well.

This appeal is not allowed to protest "health concerns," as the letter from Brad Underwood has stated, so it won't. The project and public outreach fail to comply with the following code sections:

## SMMC 17.10.070 (a)(3)

The project failed to show the public a comparative analysis for location. As such, it is located adjacent to residential areas. A requested "gap map" from the community meeting was never provided. This site, like another proposed by Modus on Delaware St. do not comply with the intent of the following section

## SMMC 17.10.090 site location guidelines

The project is located within a lot distance of single and multi family housing. The Delaware site is also residential and adjacent to San Mateo High School.

## SMMC 17.10.100 Design Regulations

(A)(1) the proposed project will cause discomfort and annoyance as it is taller than the freeway sound wall, and adjacent building. It will be within continuous view from the only pedestrian bridge in San Mateo north of 3rd Street, and will be viewable from neighboring residential buildings

SMMC 17.10.100(a)(4) as mentioned in the community meeting, the antennae site may grow once sited without risk of public appeal. The current wattage proposed may grow to a buzzing ~40,000 Watts and still comply with FCC limits. This wattage level will make noise, and will be non compliant with this section without the ability for the public to appeal at each incremental increase.

This concludes my formal protest/appeal.
