REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS AND STAFF

Commissioner St. Clair acknowledged that today is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day.

Ms. Chow shared an email to the Commissioners that Peninsula Clean Energy (PCE) At-A-Glance estimated for 2018 that 2.4% was the City's opt-out rate. Also stated that the e-Scooter Emergency ordinance exprises February 4, 2019. A 90-day extension is being prepared to go to Council for continued outreach and study in Febuary/March on the existing bike share program, community interest in scooters, and the public's safety.

Commissioner Rowinski would like the topic of water conservation, water re-use, and reclaimed water back to the Crystal Springs reservoir on a future agenda. (Ms. Kleinbaum commented that Public Works is planning a Clean Water Program update and a discussion on water re-use to the commission.)

Commissioner Reyes suggested a discussion of the overall sewer lateral strategy even after Council has taken action so that the commission has a better understanding of Council issues, including outreach and the grant program. A majority of the commissioners agreed.

Chair Robbins adjourned in honor of law enforcement personnel which keep us safe in the city and our state.
